Introduction

Tranquility^{*} product evaluation trials were conducted at two Texas LTC Communities. Each organization agreed to use Tranquility Premium superabsorbent briefs and underpads for a 30-day period in place of their existing brand products. Trial goals included improving clinical outcomes in the area of leakage/containment, skin health (IAD), odor reduction and falls, as well as increasing staff wellbeing.



Improving Resident Outcomes

Challenges in 30-day period prior to evaluation:

- 6 IAD wounds
- 7 incontinence-related falls
- 9 UTIs
- Incontinence Odor



Reducing Staff Burden

Product Evaluation 2:

Challenges in 30-day period prior to evaluation:

 Staff was performing 4 changes (requiring bed strips) per night on an obese incontinent resident.



Potential labor-saving estimate

(Assumes full change = 30 minutes of labor)


- Reduction of 3 changes per night = 1.5 hours per day
- Equals 10.5 hours per week = 45 hours per month
- Equals 547 hours per year @ \$15 per hour

Summary
